Subject: Spaces to work on Main Campus

Dear Lobos,

I know this term is different, and it's hard. None of us has full control over all the things that would make SARS-CoV-2 go away. People are stressed and that makes everything a little harder. But each of us is adapting and learning to manage the things we do control.

As we hear from you about what you need to stay on track, UNM will be adapting classes and the campus. We do have to keep some buildings closed or on limited operations to keep the community safe. But we heard that you don't have places to hang out between classes on main campus, or to have internet access for remote learning when your home is not available or equipped. **So here are some places that are open or will open on Monday, August 24th, so that you have a place to study, eat, use a computer, and exercise.**

NEW OPENINGS AND EXTENDED HOURS:

Student Union Building (SUB): open from 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM during the week: food, study space, computer pods.

Dane Smith Hall: 7:30 AM – 9:00 PM for Monday – Thursday, 7:30 AM – 5:00 PM on Friday, closed on Weekends: food, study space available in central atrium, computer pods.

Mitchell Hall: 6:30 AM – 8:00 PM Monday/Wednesday/Friday and 8:30 AM – 5:00 PM Tuesday/Thursday.

Study Tent (Lobo Shade) on Smith Plaza: shaded study and eating space with WiFi availability, opening on Monday, August 24th.

CTLB: 8:00 AM – 2:00 PM, Monday - Friday. Einstein's Bagels!

Computer Pods: Dane Smith Hall, 8:00 AM – 8:00 PM Monday thru Thursday and 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM Friday; Student Union Building: 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM during the week (and soon extending to 5:00 PM).

Musical Campus: outdoor music classrooms and practice spaces near Center for the Arts.

Johnson Field: open for exercise. Please wear a mask so that we can keep this open.

LIMITED and REMOTE ACCESS

Johnson Center: limited access only for classes, research activities, volleyball team training.

Libraries: The main libraries (including Zimmerman, Health Science Library, and Law Library) are maintaining online services. Zimmerman has curbside pickup.
